The phrase originally appeared in French as je pense, donc je suis in his Discourse on the Method, so as to reach a wider audience than Latin would have allowed. "I think, therefore I am" is merely a summary statement - kind of like "All effects must have a cause". If you want to ask a meaningful question, you need to ask if the entire rational thinking process by Descartes has a logical fallacy (vs. just a summary statement).

Is there logical fallacy in 'I think, therefore I am,' and ...

I Think, Therefore I Am is constructed from very short, usually a 2-3 page overview of each of the world's most famous philosophers and their work. Obviously, from such superficial summaries you will not learn "all the philosophy you need to know".
